<b>Short Course Content</b>	Each academic year, the course is shaped in terms of a social problem and group that the students will take as a subject within the framework of their interest and awareness. The course is shaped by providing a theoretical basis for the relevant problem and then enabling students to observe and encounter facts in the field. In this respect, the necessary coordination with the necessary non-governmental organisations and legal profession organisations is ensured and the active participation of students in these areas is aimed.
